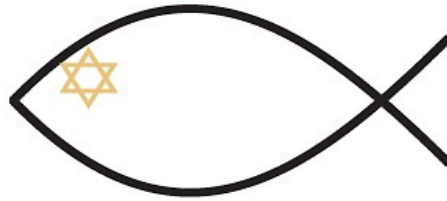

Throughout the Torah and Prophets, God has proclaimed the coming of the Messiah. This presentation offers in table form, God's promises and fulfillment of His promises as provided in His Word.

Birth of the Messiah

The Messiah would come from the seed of a woman, not a man.

"I will put animosity between you and the woman, and between your descendant and her descendant; he will bruise your head, and you will bruise his heel" Genesis 3:15	but when the appointed time arrived, God sent forth his Son. He was born from a woman, born into a culture in which legalistic perversion of the Torah was the norm, so that he might redeem those in subjection to this legalism and thus enable us to be made God's sons. Galatians 4:4 - 5 "and she gave birth to her first child, a son..." Luke 2:7

Numbers 24:17</p>	<p>Genealogy through adoptive father Yoseph: Matthew 1:1 - 17</p> <p>This is the genealogy of Yeshua the Messiah, son of David, son of Avraham: Avraham was the father of Yitz'chak, Yitz'chak was the father of Ya`akov, Ya`akov was the father of Y'hudah and his brothers, Y'hudah was the father of Peretz and Zerach (their mother was Tamar), Peretz was the father of Hetzron, Hetzron was the father of Ram, Ram was the father of `Amminadav, `Amminadav was the father of Nachshon, Nachshon was the father of Salmon, Salmon was the father of Bo`az (his mother was Rachav), Bo`az was the father of `Oved (his mother was Rut), `Oved was the father of Yishai, Yishai was the father of David the king. David was the father of Shlomo (his mother was the wife of Uriyah), Shlomo was the father of Rechav`am, Rechav`am was the father of Aviyah, Aviyah was the father of Asa, Asa was the father of Y'hoshafat, Y'hoshafat was the father of Yoram, Yoram was the father of `Uziyahu, `Uziyahu was the father of Yotam, Yotam was the father of Achaz, Achaz was the father of Hizkiyahu, Hizkiyahu was the father of M'nasheh, M'nasheh was the father of Amon, Amon was the father of Yoshiyahu, Yoshiyahu was the father of Y'khanyahu and his brothers at the time of the Exile to Bavel. After the Babylonian Exile, Y'khanyahu was the father of Sh'altiel, Sh'altiel was the father of Z'rubavel, Z'rubavel was the father of Avihud, Avihud was the father of Elyakim, Elyakim was the father of `Azur, `Azur was the father of Tzadok, Tzadok was the father of Yakhin, Yakhin was the father of El'ichud, El'ichud was the father of El`azar, El`azar was the father of Mattan, Mattan was the father of Ya`akov, Ya`akov was the father of Yosef the husband of Miryam, from whom was born the Yeshua who was called the Messiah. Thus there were fourteen generations from Avraham to David, fourteen generations from David to the Babylonian Exile, and fourteen generations from the Babylonian Exile to the Messiah.</p> <p>Genealogy of Jesus through mother Mary: Luke 3:23 – 38</p> <p>Yeshua was about thirty years old when he began his public ministry. It was supposed that he was a son of Yosef who was of Eli, of Mattat, of Levi, of Malki, of Yannai, of Yosef, of Mattityahu, of Amotz, of Nachum, of Hesli, of Naggai, of Machat, of Mattityahu, of Shim`i, of Yosef, of Yodah, of Yochanan, of Reisha, of Z'rubavel, of Sh'altiel, of Neri, of Malki, of Addi, of Kosam, of Elmadan, of Er, of Yeshua, of Eli`ezer, of Yoram, of Mattat, of Levi, of Shim`on, of Y'hudah, of Yosef, of Yonam, of Elyakim, of Mal`ah, of Manah, of Mattatah, of Natan, of David, of Yishai, of `Oved, of Bo`az, of Salmon, of Nachshon, of Amminadav, of Admin, of Arni, of Hetzron, of Peretz, of Y'hudah, of Ya`akov, of Yitz'chak, of Avraham, of Terach, of Nachor, of S`rug, of Re`u, of Peleg, of `Ever, of Shelah, of Keinan, of Arpakhshad, of Shem, of Noach, of Lemekh, of Metushelach, of Hanokh, of Yered, of Mahalal`el, of Keinan, of Enosh, of Shet, of Adam, of God.</p>

Micah 5:2</p>	<p>"After Yeshua was born in Beit-Lechem in the land of Y'hudah during the time when Herod was king, Magi from the east came to Yerushalayim" Matthew 2:1</p> <p>"So Yosef, because he was a descendant of David, went up from the town of Natzeret in the Galil to the town of David, called Beit-Lechem, in Y'hudah, 5 to be registered, with Miryam, to whom he was engaged, and who was pregnant. 6 While they were there, the time came for her to give birth; 7 and she gave birth to her first child, a son. She wrapped him in cloth and laid him down in a feeding trough, because there was no space for them in the living-quarters..." Luke 2:4 - 7</p>

It will remain built for sixty-two weeks [of years], with open spaces and moats; but these will be troubled times." Daniel 9:25</p>	<p>"Around this time, Emperor Augustus issued an order for a census to be taken throughout the Empire. 2 This registration, the first of its kind, took place when Quirinius was governing in Syria. 3 Everyone went to be registered, each to his own town. 4 So Yosef, because he was a descendant of David, went up from the town of Natzeret in the Galil to the town of David, called Beit-Lechem, in Y'hudah, 5 to be registered, with Miryam, to whom he was engaged, and who was pregnant." The Messiah was to be born of a virgin

<p>"Therefore Adonai himself will give you people a sign: the young woman will become pregnant, bear a son and name him 'Immanu El [God is with us]." Isaiah 7:14</p>	<p>"Here is how the birth of Yeshua the Messiah took place. When his mother Miryam was engaged to Yosef, before they were married, she was found to be pregnant from the Ruach HaKodesh." Matthew 1:18</p> <p>" In the sixth month, the angel Gavri'el was sent by God to a city in the Galil called Natzeret, 27 to a virgin engaged to a man named Yosef, of the house of David; the virgin's name was Miryam. 28 Approaching her, the angel said, "Shalom, favored lady! ADONAI is with you!" 29 She was deeply troubled by his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. 30 The angel said to her, "Don't be afraid, Miryam, for you have found favor with God. 31 Look! You will become pregnant, you will give birth to a son, and you are to name him Yeshua. 32 He will be great, he will be called Son of Ha`Elyon. The Messiah would be preceded by a forerunner

<p>"Look! I am sending my messenger to clear the way before me; and the Lord, whom you seek, will suddenly come to his temple. Yes, the messenger of the covenant, in whom you take such delight - look! Here he comes," says ADONAI-Tzva'ot" Malachi 3:1</p> <p>"A voice cries out: "Clear a road through the desert for ADONAI! Level a highway in the 'Aravah for our God!" Isaiah 40:3</p>	<p>"It was just as had been written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Yesha`yahu, "The voice of someone crying out: `In the desert prepare the way for ADONAI! Make straight paths for him!" Luke 3:4</p> <p>"When the messengers from Yochanan had gone, Yeshua began speaking to the crowds about Yochanan: "What did you go out into the desert to see? Reeds swaying in the breeze? No? then what did you go out to see? Someone who was well dressed? But people who dress beautifully and live in luxury are found in kings' palaces. Nu, so what did you go out to see? A prophet! Yes, and I tell you he's much more than a prophet. This is the one about whom the Tanakh says, `See, I am sending out my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way before you.' I tell you that among those born of women there has not arisen anyone greater than Yochanan the Immerser! Yet the one who is least in the Kingdom of Heaven is greater than he!" Luke 7:24 - 28</p>

At that moment heaven was opened, he saw the Spirit of God coming down upon him like a dove," Matthew 3:16</p>

The Messiah would be declared the Son of God

The Messiah would preach in Galilee

God's Promise	Fulfillment of God's Promise
<p>"But there will be no more gloom for those who are now in anguish. In the past the land of Z'vulun and the land of Naftali were regarded lightly; but in the future he will honor the way to the lake, beyond the Yarden, Galil-of-the-Goyim. 2 The people living in darkness have seen a great light; upon those living in the land that lies in the shadow of death, light has dawned." Isaiah 9:1 - 2</p>	<p>"He has with him his winnowing fork; and he will clear out his threshing floor, gathering his wheat into the barn but burning up the straw with unquenchable fire! Then Yeshua came from the Galil to the Yarden to be immersed by Yochanan. But Yochanan tried to stop him. "You are coming to me? I ought to be immersed by you!" However, Yeshua answered him, "Let it be this way now, because we should do everything righteousness requires." Then Yochanan let him. " Matthew 3:12 - 16</p>

The Messiah would be a prophet

<p>"ADONAI will raise up for you a prophet like me from among yourselves, from your own kinsmen. You are to pay attention to him," Deuteronomy 18:15</p>	<p>"Philip found Natan'el and told him, "We've found the one that Moshe wrote about in the Torah, also the Prophets -- it's Yeshua Ben-Yosef from Natzeret!" John 1:45</p> <p>"When the people saw the miracle he had performed, they said, "This has to be `the prophet' who is supposed to come into the world." John 6:14</p> <p>"Therefore, repent and turn to God, so that your sins may be erased; so that times of refreshing may come from the Lord's presence; and he may send the Messiah appointed in advance for you, that is, Yeshua. He has to remain in heaven until the time comes for restoring everything, as God said long ago, when he spoke through the holy prophets. For Moshe himself said, 'ADONAI will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your brothers. You are to listen to everything he tells you. Everyone who fails to listen to that prophet will be removed from the people and destroyed.' Indeed, all the prophets announced these days, starting with Sh'mu'el and continuing through all who followed. "You are the sons of the prophets; and you are included in the covenant which God made with our fathers when he said to Avraham, 'By your seed will all the families of the earth be blessed.' Psalm 78:1 - 2</p>	<p>"All these things Yeshua said to the crowds in parables; indeed, he said nothing to them without using a parable. 35 This was to fulfill what had been spoken through the prophet, "I will open my mouth in parables, I will say what has been hidden since the creation of the universe." The Messiah would perform miracles

God's Promise	Fulfillment of God's Promise
<p>"Strengthen your drooping arms, and steady your tottering knees. Say to the fainthearted, "Be strong and unafraid! Here is your God; he will come with vengeance; with God's retribution he will come and save you." Then the eyes of the blind will be opened, and the ears of the deaf will be unstopped; then the lame man will leap like a deer, and the mute person's tongue will sing. For in the desert, springs will burst forth, streams of water in the 'Aravah;" Isaiah 35:3 - 7</p>	<p>"Meanwhile, Yochanan the Immerser, who had been put in prison, heard what the Messiah had been doing; so he sent a message to him through his talmidim, asking, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for someone else?" Yeshua answered, "Go and tell Yochanan what you are hearing and seeing -- the blind are seeing again, the lame are walking, people with tzara'at are being cleansed, the deaf are hearing, the dead are being raised, the Good News is being told to the poor -- and how blessed is anyone not offended by me!" Matthew 11:2 - 6</p>

The Messiah would be compassionate

God's Promise	Fulfillment of God's Promise
<p>"The Spirit of Adonai ELOHIM is upon me, because ADONAI has anointed me to announce good news to the poor. He has sent me to heal the brokenhearted; to proclaim freedom to the captives, to let out into light those bound in the dark; 2 to proclaim the year of the favor of ADONAI and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn," Isaiah 61:1 - 2</p>	<p>"Now when he went to Natzeret, where he had been brought up, on Shabbat he went to the synagogue as usual. He stood up to read, and he was given the scroll of the prophet Yesha`yahu. Unrolling the scroll, he found the place where it was written, "The Spirit of ADONAI is upon me because he has anointed me to announce Good News to the poor; he has sent me to proclaim freedom for the imprisoned and renewed sight for the blind, to release those who have been crushed, to proclaim a year of the favor of ADONAI." After closing the scroll and returning it to the shammash, he sat down; and the eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fixed on him. He started to speak to them: "Today, as you heard it read, this passage of the Tanakh was fulfilled!" Luke 4:16 - 21</p>

The Messiah would preach and heal but His ministry would not be understood

God's Promise	Fulfillment of God's Promise
<p>"He said, "Go and tell this people: 'Yes, you hear, but you don't understand. You certainly see, but you don't get the point!' 10 "Make the heart of this people [sluggish with] fat, stop up their ears, and shut their eyes. Otherwise, seeing with their eyes, and hearing with their ears, then understanding with their hearts, they might repent and be healed!" Isaiah 6:9 - 10</p>	<p>"Then the talmidim came and asked Yeshua, "Why are you speaking to them in parables?" He answered, "Because it has been given to you to know the secrets of the Kingdom of Heaven, but it has not been given to them. For anyone who has something will be given more, so that he will have plenty; but from anyone who has nothing, even what he does have will be taken away. Here is why I speak to them in parables: they look without seeing and listen without hearing or understanding. That is, in them is fulfilled the prophecy of Yesha`yahu which says, `You will keep on hearing but never understand, and keep on seeing but never perceive, because the heart of this people has become dull -- with their ears they barely hear, and their eyes they have closed, so as not to see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their heart, and do t'shuvah, so that I could heal them.' But you, how blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear! Yes indeed! I tell you that many a prophet and many a tzaddik longed to see the things you are seeing but did not see them, and to hear the things you are hearing but did not hear them." Matthew 13:10 - 17</p>

The Messiah would have zeal for the Temple

God's Promise	Fulfillment of God's Promise
<p>"I am estranged from my brothers, an alien to my mother's children, because zeal for your house is eating me up, and on me are falling the insults of those insulting you." Psalm 69:8 - 9</p>	<p>"It was almost time for the festival of Pesach in Y'hudah, so Yeshua went up to Yerushalayim. In the Temple grounds he found those who were selling cattle, sheep and pigeons, and others who were sitting at tables exchanging money. He made a whip from cords and drove them all out of the Temple grounds, the sheep and cattle as well. He knocked over the money-changers' tables, scattering their coins; and to the pigeon-sellers he said, "Get these things out of here! How dare you turn my Father's house into a market?" (His talmidim later recalled that the Tanakh says, "Zeal for your house will devour me.")" John 2:13 - 17</p> <p>Also found in Matthew 21:12 - 17</p> <p>"He said to them, "It has been written, 'My house will be called a house of prayer.' But you are making it into a den of robbers!" (v13)</p> <p>Also found in Luke 19:45 - 48 and Mark 11:15 - 19</p>

The Messiah would be hated without cause

God's Promise	Fulfillment of God's Promise
<p>"Those who hate me for no reason outnumber the hairs on my head. My persecutors are powerful, my enemies accuse me falsely. Am I expected to return things I didn't steal?" Psalm 69:4</p>	<p>"Whoever hates me hates my Father also. 24 If I had not done in their presence works which no one else ever did, they would not be guilty of sin; but now, they have seen them and have hated both me and my Father. 25 But this has happened in order to fulfill the words in their Torah which read, 'They hated me for no reason at all.'" John 15:23 - 25</p>

The Messiah would be rejected

God's Promise	Fulfillment of God's Promise
<p>"People despised and avoided him, a man of pains, well acquainted with illness. Like someone from whom people turn their faces, he was despised; we did not value him." Isaiah 53:3</p>	<p>"This was the true light, which gives light to everyone entering the world. He was in the world -- the world came to be through him -- yet the world did not know him. He came to his own homeland, yet his own people did not receive him. But to as many as did receive him, to those who put their trust in his person and power, he gave the right to become children of God, not because of bloodline, physical impulse or human intention, but because of God." John 1:9 - 13</p> <p>"You keep examining the Tanakh because you think that in it you have eternal life. Those very Scriptures bear witness to me, but you won't come to me in order to have life! "I don't collect praise from men, but I do know you people -- I know that you have no love for God in you! I have come in my Father's name, and you don't accept me; if someone else comes in his own name, him you will accept. How can you trust? You're busy collecting praise</p>

	<p>from each other, instead of seeking praise from God only. "But don't think that it is I who will be your accuser before the Father. Do you know who will accuse you? Moshe, the very one you have counted on! For if you really believed Moshe, you would believe me; because it was about me that he wrote. But if you don't believe what he wrote, how are you going to believe what I say?" John 5:39 - 47</p> <p>"On hearing this, everyone in the synagogue was filled with fury. They rose up, drove him out of town and dragged him to the edge of the cliff on which their town was built, intending to throw him off." 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The Messiah would be rejected by His brethren

"I am estranged from my brothers, an alien to my mother's children," Psalm 69:8	"After this, Yeshua traveled around in the Galil, intentionally avoiding Y'hudah because the Judeans were out to kill him. But the festival of Sukkot in Y'hudah was near; so his brothers said to him, "Leave here and go into Y'hudah, so that your talmidim can see the miracles you do; for no one who wants to become known acts in secret. If you're doing these things, show yourself to the world!" (His brothers spoke this way because they had not put their trust in him.)" John 7:1 - 5

The Messiah would be a priest after the order or Melchizedek

"ADONAI has sworn it, and he will never retract -"You are a cohen forever, to be compared with Malki-Tzedek" Psalm 110:4	<p>"So neither did the Messiah glorify himself to become cohen gadol; rather, it was the One who said to him, "You are my Son; today I have become your Father." If you were to put this case before a trial judge and jury, you have easily satisfied the burden of proof. There are over 50 promises used in this presentation. Many offered more than one account, that our Messiah has fulfilled God's promises as revealed to God's prophets centuries before. All God's Promises revealed to His Prophets are at least 400 years prior to their fulfillment by Jesus. Some promises go back to the time of Moses, over 1400 years before their fulfillment.

In addition to the testimonial accounts presented here, you also have eyewitness accounts of His resurrection in that over 500 people witnessed, and therefore could testify to His resurrection:

"And that He was seen of Cephas, then of the twelve: After that He was seen of above five hundred brethren at once; of whom the greater part remain unto this present, but some have fallen asleep. And that He was seen of James and then all the apostles. And last of all He was seen of me also, as of one born out of due time. For I am the least of the apostles, that am not meet to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am: And His grace which was bestowed upon me was not in vain; but I labored more abundantly than they all: yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me." 1 Corinthians 15:6 - 10

Can you truly discredit over 500 witnesses that could testify to seeing our Messiah after His death and burial?

In fact, it wasn't just a passing occurrence. Jesus spent forty days after His resurrection teaching His disciples about the things pertaining to the Kingdom of God:

"Until the day in which He was taken up, after that He through the Holy Spirit had given commandments unto the apostles whom He had chosen: To whom also He showed Himself alive after His passion by many infallible proofs, being seen of them forty days, and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God" Acts 1:2 - 3

Matthew	Jewish - a disciple of our Messiah and also a tax collector for the Roman Government. Author of the Gospel of Matthew - (directed towards the Jewish people)
Luke	Jewish - a physician and witness. Worked closely with Paul. Author of the Gospel of Luke - (directed towards the Greek people) and the Acts of the Apostles - accounts of the church's beginning.
Mark	Jewish - A believer in Messiah...not one of the 12 disciples. Traveled with Paul. Author of the Gospel of Mark - (directed towards the Roman people)
John	Jewish - a follower of John the Baptist and later Jesus. One of our Messiah's closest disciples. Author of the Gospel of John, Three Epistles and the Revelation of Messiah.
Paul	Jewish - Formerly known as Saul of Tarsus (a Pharisee) - a staunch detractor to the believers in Messiah. His mission was to destroy the "new sect of Judaism".
