V'SHAMROO V'NAY YISRAEL

The V'shamroo provides a scriptural basis for the significance of the celebration of Shabbat.

V'sham-ru v'nay Yisrael et ha-Shabbat, la-a-sote et ha-Shabbat l'doe-ro-tahm b'reet olahm, bay-nee u'vain b'nay Yisrael,

ote he l'o-lahm, key shay-shet ya-meem a-sa Adonai, et ha-sha-ma-yeem, v'et ha-a-retz, u'va-yom hahsh-ve-ee, sha-vaht va-yee-na-fahsh.
